Dear Friends in Christ,

We are pleased to announce that it is Bishop Ricken's intention to name Fr. Bill Brunner as the administrator for St. Gregory and Holy Trinity Parishes. Fr. Bill hails from the Manitowoc area and is currently finishing six years of military service as a chaplain in the US Navy. Unfortunately, Fr. Bill's release from service to the Navy has been delayed. He had planned to be available on March 1, but that date has been pushed back until July 1.

In the meantime, Fr. John Becker and other priests will continue to fill in until March 1. Then on the weekend of March 6, Fr. Paul Demuth, a retired priest from Denmark, will be named priest celebrant until June 30. Fr. Richard Klingeisen, Pastor at St. Mary's, Clarks Mills, and St. Michael's, Whitelaw, will continue as temporary parish administrator through June 30. On July 1, Fr. Bill Brunner will begin. We regret this delay and the assignment of another temporary priest celebrant, but we look forward to Fr. Paul and then finally Fr. Bill serving your parishes.
