

Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: It is reassuring to note that the disciples do not react with immediate joy when they first encounter the risen Christ. Their response instead is to

be "startled and terrified." We, too, do not always react with wholehearted joy when we encounter Jesus. He often comes to us in unexpected ways and asks us for sacrifices we don't want to make. But Jesus' response is to offer reassurance. He has the disciples look more closely, showing them the wounds he endured on the cross and eating in front of them to reassure them that he is not the ghost they fear his is. Jesus responds to our hesitation with the same reassurance. He always invites us to come closer, to see more fully who he is and what he is doing. And when we do, when we finally see him well enough, our response will echo the disciples' amazement and joy.

To Experience: We do not experience the resurrected Jesus in the same way the disciples did. We do not get to examine his wounds or have him reassure us by eating that he is human. But Jesus does continue to come to us, and we are invited to encounter him in other ways that are sometimes hard to see. He is present to us in the sacraments, in Scripture, in loving relationships, and in the people in need we encounter.

- 1. Imagine yourself amidst the disciples when Jesus appears. What would your reaction be to seeing the one you had seen die and be buried?
- What are your encounters with Christ like in your own life? Where is his presence clear? Where could you use help seeing him?
- 3. Where are you encountering joy this Easter season?

LOCKING YOUR DOORS

It seems the older I get in life, the more things I lock up. Is it me getting older? Is it the fact that there is more crime

in the world? Maybe it is a little bit of both. I remember when we moved to Manitowoc. I never locked the garage. If our car was in the driveway, I certainly didn't bother locking it during the day, and maybe not even at night. We never used the deadbolt on the door to the house. But now you can bet things are locked up and there are even a few motion-detection lights up around the yard because there are more unsavory people in the world than there used to be. I need to be able to sleep at night.

This week's Responsorial Psalm, Psalm 4, talks about David falling peacefully asleep because the Lord is bringing security to his dwelling. I guess David was worried about His household security as much as I am about mine. But the psalmist is talking about much more than security in his house. Just as there are unsavory characters in the physical world, there are some unsavory characters in the spiritual world. There are demons who are prowling the world searching for souls to ruin.

Believe it or not there is spiritual warfare going on around us all of the time. No matter how hard we try, we will always be tempted by the devil. Jesus was tempted by the devil, why shouldn't we expect the same? But God is always there to help us, and we have to decide who we are going to open the door of our soul to, to let them in, and who we are going to lock the door of our soul to, to keep them out.

The psalmist tells us, "When I call, answer me, my just God." "It's you who relieves me when I am in distress." For he knows it's God who provides the true security for our souls. It's God who is all wise and all good who will help us lock the doors of our soul to guard against attacks of the devil, and all his evil spirits who prowl about the world for the ruin of our souls.

In our time of temptation, in our time of doubt, we have to keep our faith. Even when Jesus faced death and asked His father to remove this cup, Jesus kept faith in His Father's plan. So should we because our faith is not just feelings. We can base our faith in facts. The facts are that Jesus died for our sins; He rose from the dead to show us eternal life, and He also awaits us.

So, when we feel afraid, when we have doubts, when we have worries, and when we don't feel secure in this world, we do not have to struggle alone. We can put our hope and trust in the Lord. Let us follow Jesus' examples here on earth. Jesus continually prayed and so should we. Jesus gave us the sacraments. Let us boldly use them!

When those times of doubt, fear, and insecurity come, we do not have to worry if we have shut the windows, locked the doors, and reset the security alarm. We have a God who calls us into a relationship with Him. He asks us to bring all things to Him in prayer and sacrament. If we lay the security of our souls in His care, you and I will be able to fall peacefully asleep because it is, "You alone O Lord who brings security to my soul."

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I announced at the end of Masses last weekend: The bishop has decided to move me. I will remain the parish administrator of both of these parishes until June 30, 2024. Beginning July 1, 2024, I will be the parish administrator of Corpus Christi Parish in Sturgeon Bay and Holy Name of Mary Parish in Maplewood.

Beginning July 1, 2024, Fr. Patrick Costello will serve as parish administrator. Fr. Patrick currently serves as the parochial vicar (associate pastor) at St. Pius X Parish in Appleton. His time at the parishes will be short. His assignment will conclude on August 31, 2024, when he will leave to begin his training as a navy chaplain. It is the bishop's intention to assign a new international priest to serve as parish administrator, beginning September 1, 2024.

I am sharing with you all the information that I have to offer.

As I reflect on my two years of ministry at both of these parishes, I will be filled with gratitude. At the end of my service in the navy, I was worn out and have found School Hill and St. Nazianz to be a place where I have healed, and really re-discovered the joy of being a priest. My heart is filled with gratitude that God has given me the time here that He has. Your welcome and hospitality, support and prayers, have all been much more than I deserve. Thank you.

These two parishes are amazing, and God will continue to do amazing things here. With the level of personal investment and initiative that so many parishioners have, I am confident that there will be continued growth and new life at both of these parishes. In cooperation with the grace that God has given to these communities, I do ask for the following:


- Be generous with your service to the parishes. In particular, one thing that will help these parishes to grow and will be of great assistance to your next administrator when he arrives will be full pastoral councils. Each parishes' pastoral council can have up to twelve members. During the months of April and May, I would like to see the pastoral councils at both parishes be filled to capacity.
- Secondly, let the promotion of priestly vocations be a • central focus of these parishes. In the church, we do not always talk as directly as we should. So let's be direct, the main reason that parishes in the diocese of Green Bay do not have the stability of long-term pastors is the continued shortage of priests. Pray for more vocations to the priesthood. Encourage your sons, grandsons, and nephews to be priests. I am convinced that there are four priestly vocations among the young men and boys at St. Gregory Parish, and two priestly vocations among the young men and boys at Holy Trinity Parish. It will be a joy for me to return to these parishes multiple times to share in the celebration of the first Mass of the priest sons from these parishes.

"Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might." Ephesians 6:10 UPDATED STIPEND & STOLE FEE STRUCTURE

The diocese and our parishes are grateful to all those who have generously provided a donation for Masses, Funerals, Weddings and Quinceaneras in the past. The donation for these sacraments and services has remained the same for over thirty years throughout the Dioceses of Wisconsin. Recently, when the Bishops of the State of Wisconsin gathered, they decreed that stipends should be adjusted to reflect the current time.

> The new stipend structure is as follows: Mass Stipend \$20 Funeral Stole fee \$75 Wedding & Quinceanera Stole fee \$100

This new fee structure will become effective July 1, 2024. It will <u>not</u> be applied retroactively to those who have already paid the appropriate amount from the former fee scale. The new fee structure will be applied to all new requests received as of July 1, 2024. As always, if someone is not able to offer the stipend, the parish is happy to provide the sacrament or service with no fee. Please know, too, that any stipend money collected goes to the parish in support of its ministry and services provided to the parish community; it does not go personally to the priest.


A Notification from the Vicar General

"In recent years, it has become increasingly common for some Catholics to be married, without Church permission, in civil or quasi-religious ceremonies. There are a variety of reasons for this phenomenon, but



it must be stated that these ceremonies are not sacramental marriages. As Catholics, we uniquely believe that marriage is a sacrament, and because of this reality, we usually celebrate it in a parish church where the Christian community gathers to pray. In almost all cases, the only authentic celebrant of a Catholic marriage is a bishop, priest or deacon. Also occasionally seen today are Catholic laypeople who, acting on their own, organize, lead, or even witness, on the part of the state, the vows of the couple. These individuals do not represent the Catholic Church in performing marriages and have no religious authority to do so. Such ceremonies, although legally marriages in the state of Wisconsin, are not sacraments, and thus the couple has not received the Sacrament of Matrimony. If you have further questions about these important matters, please speak with your parish priest."

Mass for a Priest with the Suffix "LBA"

Have you noticed on occasion a Mass intention for the repose of the soul of a priest with the letters LBA after his name? LBA is the acronym for the Leo Benevolent Association. The Leo Benevolent Association was founded in the 1890's by the priests of Green Bay as a mutual aid society for the priests of the diocese. Every priest of the Diocese of Green Bay is automatically a member. The LBA provides a pension for the retired priests, and provides for priests who find themselves in financial need. When a member of the LBA dies, every member of LBA is required to offer three Masses for the repose of the soul of the priest who has passed away. Since this is a requirement, the parish does not collect a stipend for these Masses.
