Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Mark's depiction of Jesus is often noted for its frenetic pace, and that whirlwind is on full display in this passage. Jesus meets need after need, and he responds time and time again. He heals those with whom he has a connection, like Simon's mother-in-law, and he heals those who come to him as strangers. All who encounter him leave changed by the encounter, but at the speed he's working it's hard to see how he'd have time to interact personally, to see each person wholly as they are. Even at his frenetic pace, Jesus also prioritizes prayer—he rises early, before the crowds can catch him, and he finds a deserted place. There is perhaps a bit of tension here between his mission—"for this purpose have I come"—and his very human need to be alone, to regroup, to spend time with God.

To Experience: Whatever sort of work we do—manual labor, parenting, office work, scholarly work—can be sanctified to God. All of these can become part of bringing God's love and truth more fully into the world. But they can also run the risk of becoming tedious. Even Jesus retreats from his work, escaping the crowds for a deserted place in which to pray. God made us for rest too.

1. How does your work—at your job, at home, in your community—bring glory to God? Where might it present an opportunity to live your faith more fully?
2. How do you carve out time for prayer in the midst of the busyness of your life?
3. How do you respond to God's call to rest?

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We continue looking at Bishop Ricken's "Five Alive Practices for Getting More Out of the Mass," from his pastoral letter, *"Encountering Jesus in the Eucharist."* The second practice we will look at is "lectio divina." This phrase is Latin for "divine reading." In the simplest terms, lectio divina is a careful reading of Scripture and approaching it as a living Word that still has the ability to speak to our hearts. My spiritual director in seminary would say that lectio divina is reading Scripture with the heart, more than with the head.

The classic Catholic text about lectio divina is "The Ladder of Monks" by the monk Guido the Second. Even though it was written nearly 850 years ago, it is still easy to read and understand.*

Lectio divina is divided into four steps: (1) reading (2) meditating (3) praying and (4) contemplating. Over the Sundays of February, we will look at each of these steps in turn.

The first step is reading. A good starting point is to begin with the Gospel reading for Mass for the upcoming Sunday.

The first thing to understand is that this is reading to hear what God is saying. Just as Elijah only heard God in the still small voice (see 1 Kings 19:12), in order to hear the voice of God speaking to us through these sacred words, we need to quiet both our room and the inner room of our heart. Begin by placing yourself in the presence of God, take a few deep breaths, and then begin reading. This is not speed reading. As your mind and heart ponders the words, if your heart is drawn to a particular word or phrase, pause there. Repeat that phrase a few times. Then continue.

It is helpful to read the passage out loud. This may seem strange at first when you are alone, but it does make a difference. After reading the passage, pause for a moment of prayerful rest, then read the passage again. Read it through in the same deliberate way three or four times.

This is reading for "quality," not "quantity." This type of reading is seeking to find how the depths of the Word of God speaks to the depth of your heart. It is alright, and perhaps even better, if the reader only ponders a few verses of scripture during their time of lectio divina.

2. Lectio Divina

Lectio divina is a Latin word, which means “divine reading” or more often translated as “spiritual reading,” and describes a way of reading the Scriptures where we gradually let go of our own agenda and open ourselves to what God wants to say to us. Scripture offers first-hand access to the word of God and tells the story of human

salvation. Catholics can pray the Scriptures through a method known as *lectio divina* to become more attuned to the word of God. Also, make prayers of spiritual communion when you can. Here’s a short, traditional one: *I wish, my Lord, to receive you, with the purity, humility, and devotion with which your most holy mother received you, with the spirit and fervor of the saints.*

A key means to reinvigorate the life of our parishes, our communities and our own prayer lives is this ancient practice of *lectio divina*. In “*Evangelii Gaudium*,” paragraph 264, Pope Francis reminds us that “the best incentive for sharing the Gospel comes from contemplating it with love, lingering over its pages and reading it with the heart. If we approach it in this way, its beauty will amaze and constantly excite us. But if this is to come about, we need to recover a contemplative spirit which can help us to realize ever anew that we have been entrusted with a treasure which makes us more human and helps us to lead a new life. There is nothing more precious which we can give to others.”

The first stage in the process is *lectio* (reading), where we read the word of God, slowly and reflectively so that it can take root in us. You allow the words and or verses to capture your heart as God speaks to your heart.

The second stage is *meditatio* (reflection), where we think about the text that we have chosen and ponder it in our hearts so we can take from it what God wants to give us. Through the Scripture passage, you may imagine yourself at the scene, images, sounds and thoughts all come to mind to draw you even more deeply into the passage.

The third stage is *oratio* (response), where we leave our thinking aside and simply let our hearts speak to God. This response is inspired by our reflection on the word of God. This stage moves you to a prayerful response as you converse with the Lord.

The final stage of *lectio divina* is *contemplatio* (rest), where we let go of our own ideas, plans and meditations and we simply rest in the word of God, a holy rest which renews and sustains us. Through this phase your attention is centered on God, and you allow him to refresh and restore you for a new beginning.

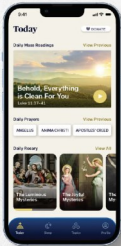

St. Gregory Parish Boiler Project Update as of 1/29/2024

Start-up of the new boiler occurred on the afternoon of January 24, 2024. Once online, the new boiler took on the heating load of both the Church and the Parish Center. The new boilers each have three separate modules inside their cabinet. It was observed that as the boiler was running and the two buildings were warming back to the normal inside temperatures, the three modules had plenty of extra capacity as they were operating at less than 50%.

The second boiler installation was completed on January 29. On January 30, a controls expert began to set-up the two boilers to operate together, or independently, as the load conditions and outside temperatures dictate.
