Thoughts for Today's Readings

To the Point: Last week's gospel gave us John's depiction of Simon and Andrew's calling; here we have the same moment as depicted by Mark. Here the

brothers are together rather than called one by one, and since John is imprisoned he is not involved in pointing the way. The stories seem contradictory and cannot both be factually true, but their different emphases help to reveal more of the ever-unfolding truth about Jesus and what it means to follow him. In this story, the apostles-to-be are called when they are in the midst of their daily work. Jesus interrupts them, and rather than ignoring him and pressing on with their work, they stop. Something about him compels them to accept this disruption to their everyday lives. They respond with extraordinary trust to something that could have been received as mere inconvenience, and they encounter God there.

To Experience: Most of the time, we won't perceive any great message in our interaction with the panhandler who asks us for change or the child who won't let us get anything done around the house. But if we practice responding to them with love and trust, we might just find in them a place of very real encounter with God. After all, the readings make clear the interruptions and inconveniences often hide opportunities for God to speak to us.

- 2. Have you ever encountered God in an interruption or inconvenience?
- 3. Where might you have missed God by dismissing something (or someone!) as a disruption?

From January through May 2024, we will be looking at the "Five Alive Practices" from Bishop Ricken's Pastoral Letter, "Encountering Jesus in the Eucharist." During the month of January we will be looking at the Sunday Mass.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We continue our discussion of Sunday Mass as we look at Bishop's "Five Alive" practices from his pastoral letter, "Encountering Jesus in the Eucharist: Disciples Called to Worship."

Last week, we looked at stories, from different times and different places, of great sacrifices that Catholics have made in order to participate in the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist. What is so valuable about Sunday Eucharist that Catholics, even in the present day, risk their livelihood, freedom, and even their life in order to take part in the Eucharist?

It is true that God is present everywhere. We call this the dogma of God's omnipresence. But even if God is present everywhere, nonetheless, God chooses to manifest His divine presence in particular times and places. We see numerous examples in the Bible itself. Moses and the Hebrew people met God at Mount Sinai, where his presence was so strong that the summit of the mountain had to be shrouded in cloud and smoke. Later, God will make His dwelling within the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. In the New Testament, Jesus chooses to be present in one place, the Holy Land, and one particular time, for the first thirty-three years of the first millennium. Everyone who encountered Jesus recognized that He was a unique divine presence that could not be found anyplace else.

So it is also true with coming to church on Sunday. You can, and in fact should, pray at home, but the Lord is not present there the way He is present in the church. Jesus, Himself, teaches that where two or three are gathered in His name, He is present among them. The church gathers in His name, and He is truly present. He is present in His Word, especially when it is proclaimed by a person of faith to a people assembled in Faith. The Second Vatican Council is even as bold as to say that when the Sacred Word is proclaimed in the Sacred Assembly, God is speaking again. Lastly, and most importantly, in the Catholic Church, Jesus is encountered in the Eucharist, and the Eucharist cannot be found anyplace else. Before the Eucharist, we are in the presence of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus.

Our brothers and sisters in Christ that continue to suffer persecutions for their beliefs, continue to risk everything for Sunday, since they know on Sunday they encounter Jesus in a way that they do not encounter Him any place else.

Having Mass broadcasted over TV and the internet is part of the reality of our world. It is a blessing for the sick and homebound. But it does not substitute for being physically and personally present at the celebration of the Mass for those who are not physically or medically impeded. Imagine if you were invited to a friend's house for dinner, and instead of finding a banquet laid out before you, they had you watch a cooking show and showed you photographs of food. Your hunger would not be satisfied. Simply watching Mass on TV cannot satisfy the hunger of the soul.



Mass for the People of the Parish

Each week, normally on one of the Sunday Masses, you will notice that one of the Masses is offered for the "People of Holy Trinity and St. Gregory Parishes." This Mass is referred to as the "pro populo"

Mass, which is Latin "for the people." Per Code of Canon Law* the pastor of a parish (or in this case the parish administrator) is obligated to offer Mass for the benefit of the people of the parish each Sunday and every Holy Day of Obligation. Since this is a requirement of the law, the parish does not collect a stipend for this Mass. For a priest that has care of more than one parish, he may offer one Mass to cover all the parishes he serves. On occasion, the Mass "pro populo" can be shifted to a weekday, but this should be the exception, and not the normal practice.

Rural Life Day Thursday, April 11 Holy Trinity Parish

What is Rural Life Day?

The following are snippets from an article published in an April 2007 issue of The Compass News:

- Months of preparations go into planning the Rural Life Days the Green Bay Diocese holds every spring to pray with and for farmers/growers as they prepare for another planting season.
- The celebrations use a set format from the diocese and include prayers to St. Isidore, patron of farmers.
- The diocese has been celebrating Rural Life Days in the spring for more than 20 years. Bp. Paul Rhode appointed the diocese's first rural life director Fr. Peter Salm in 1940.
- In the 1950s, the diocese celebrated with a single event in Green Bay for farmers around the feast of St. Isidore.
- Then Bp. Stanislaus Bona changed the one-day observance to four institutes held throughout the diocese. Three Rural Life Days were held each spring from 1989 through 2000. In 2001, that was reduced to two one in the eastern half and the other in the western part of the diocese.
- Rural Life Days are an opportunity for people in and outside "the rural community to come together in a day of prayer, a day of socialization and a day of learning to celebrate" the rural community's gifts to the greater diocese.
- Rural Life Days are held between mid-March and the beginning of the planting season based on the schedules of the bishop and the farmers. Rural parishes are always chosen for the celebrations.
- The celebrations include Mass, a special blessing, dinner, and a speaker. A committee at the parish plans the event.


