

#### **Thoughts for Today's Readings**



**To the Point:** In whatever gospel option is used this week, you will hear about Jesus' promises for those who love and follow him. This life has

trials; sometimes there are particular trials that come with following Jesus. This is someone who loved so recklessly that he gave up his life in a cruel and humiliating way, and he calls us to take up our own crosses in imitation of him. There is no promise that this life will be easy for Christians. But after all its trials, Jesus promises rest and blessedness and utter joy in his presence. He promises a share in his own inheritance, a place in his kingdom. Those who have gone before us are also promised this love and rest and joy, and we hope that they are enjoying it now.

**To Experience:** Today's feast remembers all those who have gone before us in death, whether they are in heaven or not (yet). Prayers for the dead are an important part of the Catholic devotional life, and these feast days at the start of November remind us that we are part of a large and wonderful communion of saints that sees us through our earthly journey and into the next life.

#### **November: A Month of Remembrance**

#### Dear Friends in Christ,

In November, our Church's liturgy invites us into a profound reflection on the communion of saints and our solidarity with the faithful departed. We begin the month with the Solemnity of All Saints, a day to celebrate the countless holy men and women—both known and unknown—who have attained the fullness of eternal life with God. It is a time for joyful celebration, honoring those who have run the race and now intercede for us from their place in heaven.

The very next day, we observe the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), a special day set aside to pray for the souls of those in purgatory. This practice is rooted in our belief in the "Church Suffering"—those who have died in God's grace but are still undergoing purification before entering heaven. This beautiful tradition reminds us that our spiritual bonds do not end with death. Our prayers, especially the offering of the Holy Mass, can help them on their journey to the Beatific Vision of God.

This solemn remembrance calls to mind our own mortality and the ultimate goal of Christian life: holiness. The month of November, marking the end of the liturgical year, serves as a powerful reminder to reflect on the end of our own lives and our great hope in Christ's promise of new life.


## The Gospel of Promise and Resurrection (John 6:37–40)

The Gospel reading for All Souls' Day powerfully underpins this hope. Jesus assures us, "This is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day". This passage offers immense comfort, affirming that the Father desires eternal life for all who place their trust in His Son. Jesus' promise to lose nothing that the Father has given him is a testament to His protective love and the certainty of our resurrection.

For the faithful departed, this is the ultimate hope. For us, the living, this is a call to strengthen our faith and to trust in God's plan for salvation.

# The Tree of Souls: Remembering Our Departed Loved Ones in November

As the month of November approaches, it is a time in the Church dedicated to praying for the souls of those who departed from this life. To help us remember our loved ones, we reinstate

the Tree of Souls – a beautiful symbol where we hang the names of family members, friends, and all those who have gone before us. This tree stands as a reminder of our connection to them and our duty to pray for their eternal rest.

The Tree of Souls is not just a decoration; it represents life, memory, and hope. In the Bible, trees are often symbols of life and growth. As we write the names of our loved ones and place them on the tree, we are reminded of their lives and the impact they had on us. This simple act of placing their names on the tree becomes a form of prayer, lifting their souls up to God.

The entire month of November, however, is traditionally set aside to pray for the souls in purgatory, asking God to grant them eternal peace. You may have family members or friends who have passed away. Praying for them, as well as for those who have no one to pray for them, is a loving and merciful act.

Participating in the Tree of Souls is simple yet meaningful. You can write down the names of those who have passed away – whether family, friends, or others you want to pray for – and place the names on the tree. As you do so, take a moment to pray for them. Your prayers can be short and from the heart. You might say something like:

"Lord, I pray for (name), that you may forgive their sins and grant them eternal rest in Your presence. Amen."

The Tree of Souls reminds us that love never dies, and neither does our connection to those who have gone before us. By praying for them, we help them on their journey to eternal life and keep their memory alive in our hearts.

# Did You Know?

- Without the AMS there would be no Catholic chaplains.
  The AMS is the only Catholic diocese in the United
  States responsible for endorsing priests to serve as
  military chaplains and for the Department of Veterans
  Affairs Medical Centers.
- AMS faithful are the men and women serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at a Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - and their families.
- Programs and services readily available in other U.S. dioceses, and vital to the men, women, and children served by the AMS, include Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal, Vocations, and the pastoral care of Veterans.
- The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only U.S. Vocations Program that provides priests to serve as military chaplains, and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers.
- In 2024, the number of sacraments celebrated for AMS faithful included 1,450 baptisms, 872 confirmations, 1,127 first Holy Communions, and 143 marriages.
